#### THE BUTTERNUT CREEK TRAIL

We hope you can take some time to enjoy the Butternut Creek Trail. The area includes almost 70 acres of land with a wide paved pathway for walking, biking, and jogging. There is also an elevated boardwalk trail leading through the wetlands area to explore.







## HONORING OUR VETERANS





#### WHAT DO DEWITT ROTARY MEMBERS DO FOR THE COMMUNITY?

The Rotary Motto is "Service above Self". Pretty simple.

The object of Rotary comes down to 4 areas: the development of acquaintances as an opportunity for service, high ethical standards in business and the professions with a recognition of the opportunity to serve society, the application of service to others as an ideal in each Rotarian's life, and the advancement of international understanding and peace thorough an international fellowship of people united in serving others.

Rotarians around the world are also guided by 4 principles by which they are asked to measure their conduct and their lives. These principles are called Rotary's "Four Way Test" of the things we think, say or do. It's simply this:

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

So, what have Dewitt Rotary members done for the community since last year's Pancake Day?

Well, to mention just some of the deeds ..., Dewitt Rotarians purchased, prepared, and served food at the Samaritan Center six times this year. We funded a clothing allowance for six college freshmen through OnPoint for College, co-sponsored Red Cross Blood Drives with Dewitt Community Church and Pebble Hill Presbyterian Church. We gave out scholarships to students at JD High School and Nottingham High School student. We gave

scholarship money so that disadvantaged children could attend Camp Iroquois in Manlius and MDA Summer Camps. We provided the manpower for the Dewitt Fire Department's Breakfast with Santa. We supported the Jim & Juli Boeheim Foundation. We raised funds to purchase a ShelterBox to help with victims of natural disasters worldwide. We're selling syrup and raffle tickets at Pancake Day to help eradicate polio from the world. With the help of our Club-sponsored Interact Club at FMHS, we packed up and shipped used library books to South Africa through the Central New York Books for the World project. We held several clean-up days at our Dewitt Rotary sponsored Butternut Creek Trail where we raked, weeded, cultivated and mulched the memorial bench areas. We sold bundles of kindling wood to support Monarch Industries. We rang bells and manned the red kettles at two locations for the Salvation Army. In addition, we hawked papers for Old Newsboys and then went to the On Center and helped pack boxes of food for families to pick up at the Christmas Bureau giveaway. We gave financial support the JD Model UN group, the Onondaga Historical Society CNY History Day, and the new Dewitt Community Library being built. We continue to support Clear Path for Veterans. We helped two Eagle Scouts from Boy Scout Troop #22 with their projects. And we sponsored a chess tournament at Jamesville Elementary School. 






## **DEWITT ROTARY - SIX DECADES OF SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY**

Celebrating its 63rd Anniversary, the Rotary Club of Dewitt was chartered April 26, 1954. Twenty Dewitt businessmen founded the Club and the first Pancake Day was held at Dewitt Community Church. Some highlights follow.....

In the 60's, Dewitt Rotarians built a carousel, cabin and barbecue pit at Camp Goodwill in Chittenango, a program for disabled children. They sponsored a cerebral palsy clinic in Jamaica by bringing the clinic's teachers to S.U. to learn new treatment techniques. And the Club assisted with the Cedar Bay Park and Picnic Area as well as fundraising for the Dewitt Library.

During the 70's, the Club purchased equipment and provided monthly birthday celebrations for those with cerebral palsy that were served by the clinic at Elmcrest Children's Center and JD Middle School received help from the Club in developing a fitness trail.

The 80's start with our first annual kindling sale in 1980. All proceeds went to Monarch Industries as they do today. And the Club was already serving food at the Samaritan Center and ringing the bells for Salvation Army, as the Club does today. Also, the Supreme Court ruled in 1987 that Rotary could no longer be all-male, and the face of Rotary Clubs around the country changed.

In the 90's, Dewitt Rotary erected the Dewitt Community Bulletin Board at Erie Boulevard and Genesee Street. They donated funds to the Dewitt Fire Department for an infra-red detection system and helped the Syracuse Children' Chorus make their first trip to perform in China.

The decade beginning with 2000 included the construction of picnic tables and grills at Elmcrest Children's Center, the sponsorship of J-D Little League, and participation in Habit for Humanity. The Club dedicated funds to the 911 memorial that stands in front of the Dewitt Town Hall. Dewitt Rotary also supplied volunteers to assist the women and children from several African countries who were staying in Syracuse as part of two international projects that provided medical care for children, Gift of Vision and Gift of Life. Our first female Club President, Ellie Peterson, was elected in 2001.


Over the past six decades, Dewitt Rotary has developed into a vibrant club of 80 active members covering a diverse range of ages, backgrounds and interests. Meetings are held on Mondays at noon at Traditions at the Links, 5900 North Burdick Street in East Syracuse. Quality programs are offered at each lunch meeting, including presentations from the local universities, businesses, community organizations, elected officials, the media, and subject experts. (Our fall luncheon with Coach Boeheim always draws a crowd.)



Our annual fundraiser is Pancake Day at Shoppingtown Dewitt, always held the Saturday of Mother's Day weekend. This year, 2017, marks our 63rd event and it has truly become a community tradition. Dewitt Rotarians and other volunteers serve over 4000 meals of pancakes, sausage and all the fixings. The "Flapjack Review" newspaper is the official "morning paper" given to all attendees and all proceeds collected from ticket sales and "Flapjack" advertising goes right back to support community projects and non-profit organizations.

Dewitt Rotary's service projects address a wide variety of needs. Bundles of kindling wood made by the disabled workers at Monarch Industries are sold each fall and money collected is given back to Monarch Industries. Dewitt Rotarians go down to the OnCenter and help with the Salvation Army Christmas Bureau Give-away, sell newspapers for "Old Newsboys", and man the red kettles for Salvation Army. The Club supports the Samaritan Center soup kitchen in Syracuse by buying, preparing, and serving food to their guests several times a year and by donating toiletries and clothing items to the center. Dewitt Rotary continues to partner with the Dewitt Parks and Rec. Dept. to sponsor the Butternut Creek Trail walking trail along Butternut Creek from Kinne St. to Genesee St. Clear Path for Veterans has received support from Dewitt Rotary. And each year the Club supports new organizations and projects and becomes more involved in our own community and beyond.



#### THE RED KETTLE

Another year, another Pancake Day. I again have outlined below the origins of the RED KETTLE Campaign and its significance. But before preceding I wish to dedicate this article to our longtime fellow Rotarian and Salvation Army supporter Jim Robb. Jim passed away September 2016 at the age of 75 years and will be missed especially for his humor and being our bell ringing Rotary chair. Jim will be missed but his legacy will be carried on with our support and the cherished Jimmie Jars!

In 1891, Salvation Army Captain Joseph McFee was distraught because so many poor individuals in San Francisco were going hungry. During the holiday season, he resolved to provide a free Christmas dinner for the destitute and poor. The biggest hurdle was where would he find the funding?

He worried and thought for many days thinking how he could find the funds when he recalled his days as a sailor in England. He remembered a large, iron pot placed at the docks in Liverpool, England, that passers-by tossed a coin or two in to help the poor. So the next day he placed a pot at Oakland Ferry Crossing on Market Street with a sign reading "Keep the Pot Boiling". Soon he had enough money to buy food for the poor and a tradition was born.

Captain McFee's idea soon spread from the west coast to the Boston area and throughout the United States and today his idea has spread to many other countries. The Dewitt Rotary has helped to continue this tradition by supporting the Bell Ringing effort for over 40 years. Today we still ring bells on the Friday and Saturday, the weekend prior to Christmas. Please continue to support our efforts when you see our smiling faces whether it be at Shoppingtown, Wal-Mart, or wherever the Kettle takes us each year.

Thank you to all who continue to support the Salvation Army and their efforts to feed the needy!





## DEWITT ROTARY SUPPORTS THE SAMARITAN CENTER IN SYRACUSE

Deiwtt Rotary has a long working relationship with the Samaritan Center of Syracuse. Last year Dewitt Rotary, partnering with Marcellus Rotary, applied for a Rotary District 7150 Grant to provide the Samaritan Center with a reach-in freezer and a reach-in refrigerator. The equipment is necessary to the commercial kitchen at the Samaritan Center. They serve hot meals 365 days a year to the homeless and other food insecure people of Central New York. The two units replaced equipment that was 20 years old.

The Dewitt Rotary has several long term service projects, one of which is the Samaritan Center Soup Kitchen in downtown Syracuse. The Dewitt Rotary has been supporting the Samaritan Center financially and physically for over 2 decades. On six Saturday's throughout the year about 20 Dewitt rotarians show up at the Samaritan Center to prepare and serve a meal to a couple hundred men, women and children in need. The experience is one that you will never forget and many rotarians choose to participate every time we serve.

The Samaritan Center has been feeding those in need for 34 years and is committed to serving the hungry and those in need in order to promote their welfare dignity and self sufficiency. It is rooted in the belief that sound nutrition is the first step in enabling people to cope and become productive, self-sufficient members of society. Since 1981 Samaritan Center's mission has fought hunger in the greater Syracuse community by providing nutritious hot meals to anyone in need 7 days a week – no questions asked.

Paired with these meals is the case management support and access to services that help the guests move on to a more positive future.

Samaritan Center guests include both the young and the not so young, those who are well educated and those who are not, individuals and families, people whose lives are bound by the prison of substance abuse, people who are well and those who face the challenge of illness. Men, women and children who have in common their humanity, their poverty and their sincere gratitude for a place of safety and warmth and a nutritious meal offered every day of the year.

The Samaritan Center moved into it's beautiful new location on State Street last spring and is now more accessible to the handicapped and older guests. For more information or to learn about how you can support the Samaritan Center visit www.samcenter.org

- Through Community Service, we address local needs and work with our community to bring lasting improvements.
- Through International Service, we meet humanitarian needs around the globe and promote world understanding and peace.
- Through New Generations Service, we work with young people to help them become the next generation of leaders, visionaries, and peacemakers.

Attending weekly club meetings allows members to enjoy fellowship, enrich their professional and personal knowledge, and meet members of their community. Participation is defined as a combination of being present at lunch meetings, engaging in Rotary activities or Rotary volunteer opportunities, attending another club's meeting, or any Rotary activity outside of the club meetings that promote the goals of Rotary. To keep clubs strong, every Rotarian also shares the responsibility of bringing new people into Rotary. Even new members can bring a guest to a club meeting. Once the Board approves, we schedule you for a short Rotary orientation with the Club Membership Chair, scheduled at your convenience. This also allows you, the prospective member, an opportunity to ask any questions you may have about Dewitt Rotary or Rotary in general. Once the orientation is completed, your name is published to the entire membership by the President for 7 days. If no objections are received, we will go ahead and schedule your member induction. The whole process takes a couple short weeks.



## **OLD NEWSBOYS**


Old Newsboys and The Christmas Bureau has its roots in the Depression of the 1930's and was initiated by 3 businessmen in the Syracuse, NY area.





## THE ROTARY FOUNDATION

**HISTORY** - At the 1917 convention, outgoing RI President Arch C. Klumph proposed to set up an endowment "for the purpose of doing good in the world." In 1928, it was renamed The Rotary Foundation, and it became a distinct entity within Rotary International.

**GROWTH** - In 1929, the Foundation made its first gift of \$500 to the International Society for Crippled Children. The organization, created by Rotarian Edgar F. "Daddy" Allen, later grew into Easter Seals. When Rotary founder Paul Harris died in 1947, contributions began pouring in to Rotary International, and the Paul Harris Memorial Fund was created to build the Foundation.



#### **EVOLUTION OF PROGRAMS-**

1947: The Foundation established its first program, Fellowships for Advance Study, later known as Ambassadorial Scholarships.

1965-66: Three programs were launched: Group Study Exchange, Awards for Technical Training, and Grants for Activities in Keeping with the Objective of The Rotary Foundation, which was later called Matching Grants.

1978: Rotary introduced the Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grants. The first 3-H Grant funded a project to immunize 6 million Philippine children against polio.

1985: The PolioPlus program was launched to eradicate polio worldwide.

1987-88: The first peace forums were held, leading to Rotary Peace Fellowships.

2013: New district, global, and packaged grants enable Rotarians around the world to respond to the world's greatest needs.

Since the first donation of \$26.50 in 1917, the Foundation has received contributions totaling more than \$1 billion. The Rotary Foundation transforms your gifts into projects that change lives both close to home and around the world. ## DEWITT ROTARY IN ACTION HOLIDAY SEASON WITH THE SALVATION ARMY

Dewitt Rotary does not confine charitable activities to Pancake Day in the warm month of May. We keep busy all year round. One of the most gratifying events we participate in is the Salvation Army Christmas Bureau distribution day. And it's fun, too!

For the past 4 years, right before Christmas, Dewitt Rotary joins forces with the Salvation Army and over 1000 eager volunteers to create holiday magic for low-income families at the Oncenter. On this special day, 2500 eligible low-income families with over 7000 children receive books, toys and stocking stuffers for each child in their family. In addition, each family receives a holiday food basket that contains a turkey and all the fixings for a holiday dinner plus extra food to help them feed their children during the school break.

Throughout the year, the Salvation Army and volunteer organizations raise money and collect food and toys for the big day. How do they do this? Through Community Food and Toy Drives at local schools and companies, the Salvation Army's Annual Turkey Drive, the Teddy Toss at a Syracuse Crunch Game, and corporate support. Each year the Dewitt Rotary also helps to raise funds for the big day by ringing bells for the Red Kettle Campaign and hawking newspapers for the Old Newsboys Christmas Fund Newspaper Sale. It's our tradition – but that's another story.

Several weeks in advance of the event, we sign up with the Salvation Army for a specific time slot and to get our assignments. We've fulfilled many roles from helping families to make their gift selections, to packing the food boxes, and as general stock runners. It can be hard and tiring work, but seeing the look on the kids' faces as they choose their gifts and pick up their Christmas dinners makes it all worthwhile.

This is one of the best organized events on the planet. Logistics, traffic, and a horde of volunteers from many local businesses and organizations; the Salvation Army has it all down to a "T".





### **DEWITT ROTARY PHILANTHROPY**

The Oxford English Dictionary defines philanthropy as; the desire to promote the welfare of others, expressed especially by the generous donation of money to good causes. The origin of the word is from the Greek philanthrōpia, from philanthrōpos 'man-loving'. Rotarians firmly believe in Service Above Self, and we demonstrate this philosophy through our philanthropic work.

All of the net proceeds from today's Pancake Day are distributed by the Dewitt Rotary to local, national, and international charities. Charitable donations may range from the small – helping a Scout finance an Eagle project that benefits the community; to the larger - support of the Samaritan Center; to the huge - Polio Plus; the Rotary International's effort to wipe out polio once and for all. Some donations may be one time funding for a specific need of an organization. Other donations are provided to some groups year after year.

The Dewitt Rotary Philanthropy Committee, made up of 5 Dewitt Rotarians, reviews requests received from non-profit organizations, and advises the club Board of Directors with their recommendations. The Committee evaluates the merits of each request and conducts the research necessary to perform a fair and equitable evaluation. The Board makes the final decision on each request.

The Board periodically polls the club members to get feedback on the ultimate charitable goals members feel are important. Some of our guiding principles include:

- 1. Support of non-profit organizations with far-reaching impact, diverse populations, and a local focus such as the Samaritan Center, Clear Path for Veterans, Honor Flight, and the Dewitt Community Library.
- 2. Participation in and support of international programs such as Polio Plus (Rotary's \$1.6 billion project to wipe out polio), ShelterBox USA (delivering lifesaving aid to families affected by disaster), and Clean Water projects in the third world.
- 3. Budget sufficient funds each year to support organizations with which the club has partnered on projects such as the Dewitt Fire Department, Monarch Industries, On Point for College, Old Newsboys, and more.
- 4. Participate in District Rotary Grant Projects.
- 5. Support non-profit organizations that impact local schools and neigh borhoods in Dewitt, Syracuse, and FM.
- 6. Support youth through sponsorship of the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards and the Rotary International Youth Exchange programs.
- 7. Focus on an organization's "needs" instead of "wants".

Our philanthropy is not limited to merely donating funds to worthy organizations. We also get down into the trenches to "git 'er done". Take a walk along the Butternut Creek Trail in Dewitt to see the beautiful trail and plantings. Yup, our Rotarians are there planting, rototilling, and maintaining the trail. Visit the Samaritan Center in downtown Syracuse on a Saturday afternoon. There you will find our Rotarians preparing, serving, and cleaning up after a meal. Drive down Erie Blvd. in November. You will see Rotarians at their annual kindling sale supporting Monarch Industries. Look around as you enjoy your pancakes today. This site did not set itself up! Rotarians did it.

Today's pancake breakfast is our major fundraising event of the year. We spend almost an entire year planning this event. An event of this magnitude requires countess hours of work and planning by every Dewitt Rotarian. But it is worth all the effort because every penny earned today will be donated to a worthy cause. So, the members of our club would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your attendance. You are making a difference.





#### Frederick Bates Talbot, Sr.



After dinner Cheryl Matt, club president, gave a stirring speech and presented each honoree with a rotary tie and certificate of appreciation.



## **2017 - PANCAKE DAY RECYCLING**

2009 marked the year The Rotary Club of DeWitt began its recycling effort at Pancake Day. The purpose was to recycle and compost not only the paper products such as plates, cups and napkins, but milk cartons, empty sugar packets and all the discarded food refuse. We knew that some products like plastic wrapping and utensils couldn't go into this waste stream—those we collected separately.

With the help of OCRRA (Onondaga County Resource Recovery Agency), Art Diamond of Property Restoration and the support of a dedicated group of volunteers, the waste from Pancake Day was reduced to little more than a couple of 30-gallon garbage bags while everything else was either recycled or composted.


