Tom Bezigian introduced Frank Moses, Director of the Montezuma Audubon Center, Savannah, NY who spoke about what the center has to offer.

Frank explained the Montezuma Audubon Center (MAC) is a joint project of NYS DEC which owns center and the Audubon Society which operates it.

The Federal Government owns about 13,000 acres in the National Wildlife Refuge and the State owns another 7,000 acres. They are actively trying to attract and build the bird population. They have scientific measures to help determine whether or not the census is increasing. This is partially accomplished through their volunteer activities such as:

- The Montezuma Muckrace
- The Christmas Bird count which was just finished
- The Annual Wildlife Festival held the first weekend in May
- Their school and scout field

How do you describe the organization called "Rotary"? There are so many characteristics of a Rotary club as well as the activities of a million Rotarians. There are the features of service, internationality, fellowship, classifications of each vocation, development of goodwill and world understanding, the emphasis of high ethical standards, concern for other people and many more descriptive qualities

In 1976 the Rotary International Board of Directors was interested in creating a concise definition of the fundamental aspects of Rotary. They turned to the three men who were then serving on Rotary's Public Relations Commit-tee and requested that a onesentence definition of Rotary be prepared. After numerous drafts, the committee presented this definition, which has been used ever since in various Rotary publications:
